Please look below and read carefully the information for paper submissions for Research Committee 27 (SOG) panels of the July 2012 Madrid IPSA conference.

SOG will propose (at least) six panels that have been approved for the Congress (see the list below).

The deadline to submit abstract/paper proposals online is October 17, 2011 (the initial deadline was October 7 but has been extended)

IPSA membership is not required to make a paper proposal, although you must first complete a (free) registration with the IPSA system.

Please be sure to assign your paper proposal to RC27 SOG.

Abstracts must not exceed 1500 characters (approximately 250 words). Please do not include references, bibliographical notes, or your contact information in the abstract text.

For those who have been in touch with panel proposers, please also let them know of your interest.

Panels require a maximum of six (6) accepted papers. This may mean that panel organizers may have to do a selection. Eventually, we will ask IPSA for extra SOG panels if the number of paper proposals we receive exceed this limit.

Final panels will be assembled after Oct.17 and completed by November 10, with final notification to participants issued by IPSA early in December.
